Adam and Eve

God made the first man, Adam, and the first woman, Eve. He put them in the Garden of Eden.

These two trees represent the two ways of life: the way of give and the way of get.

God taught Adam and Eve about His way of life, then He let them choose whether they wanted to follow His way or not. He allowed Satan to test them.

One day, Eve was walking in the garden and saw a snake. Snakes did not bite, so she was not afraid. But this snake spoke to her! Eve probably did not know it, but it was *Satan* who was speaking through this serpent.

The serpent told Eve that God was a liar. It said that if she ate

Like Adam and Eve, you can choose to obey God and live God's way—or disobey and live Satan's way. You can choose to be obedient and giving, or you can choose to be disobedient and selfish.

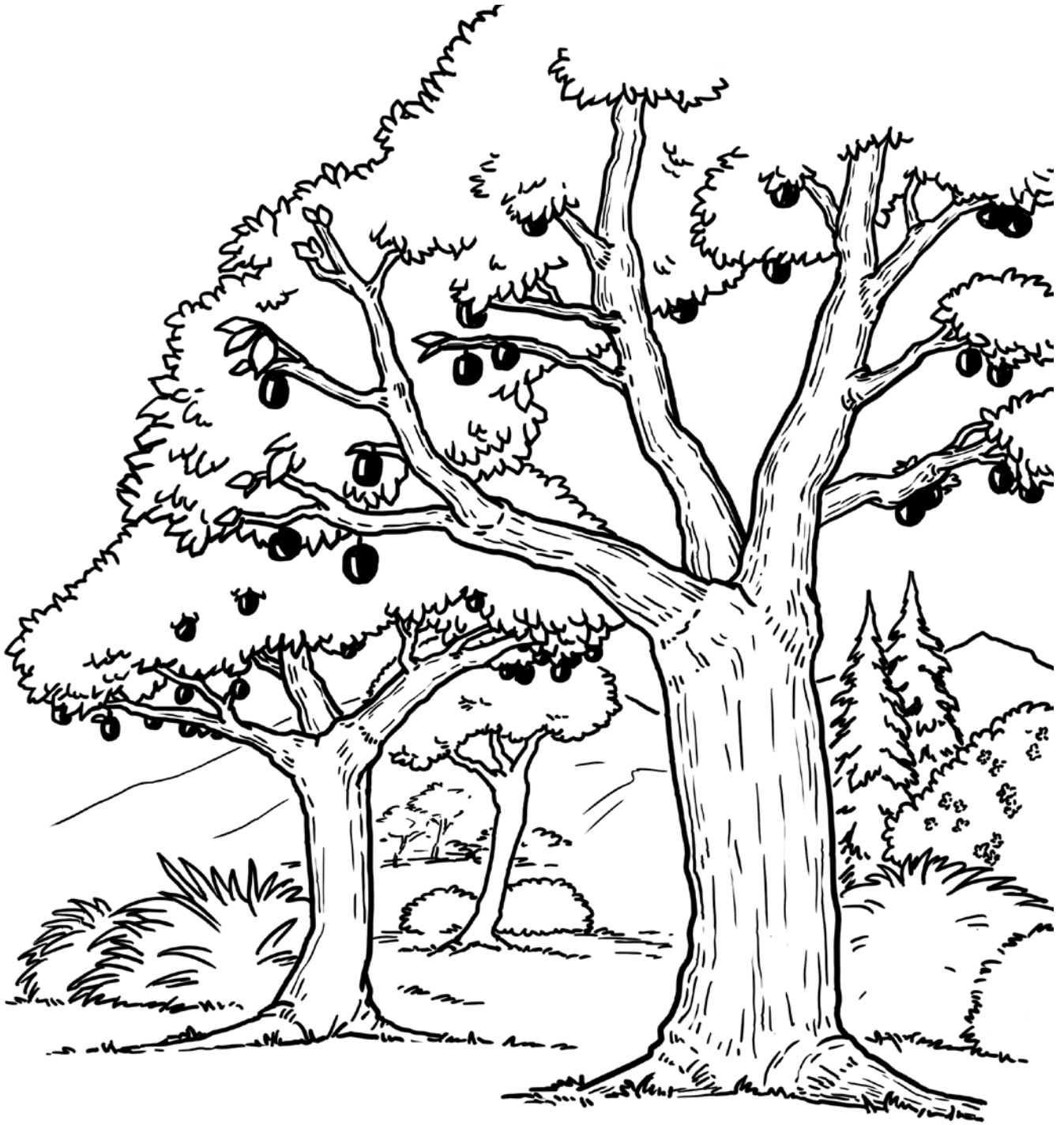

The two trees were in the midst of the garden.

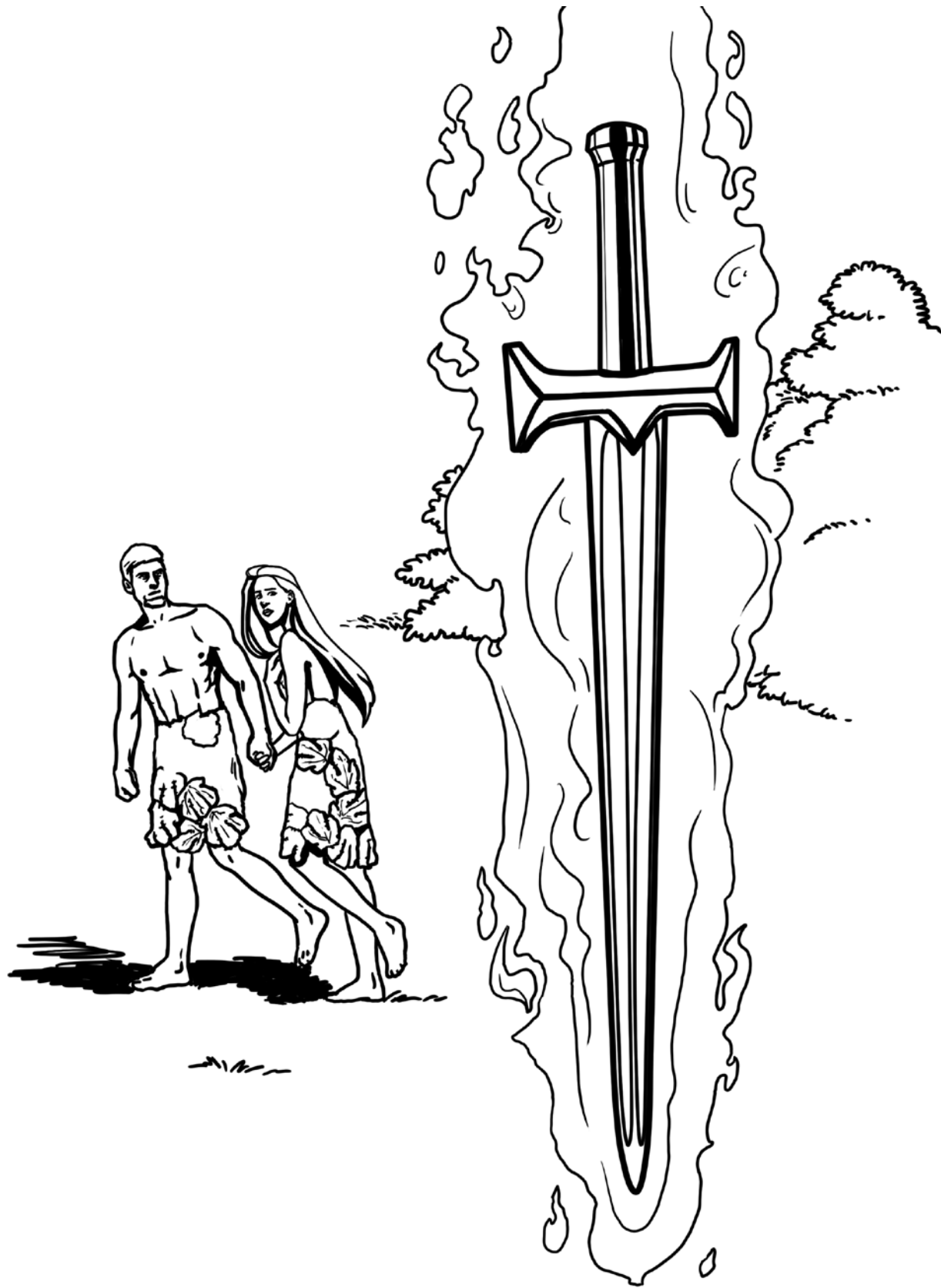


The serpent tempts Eve.

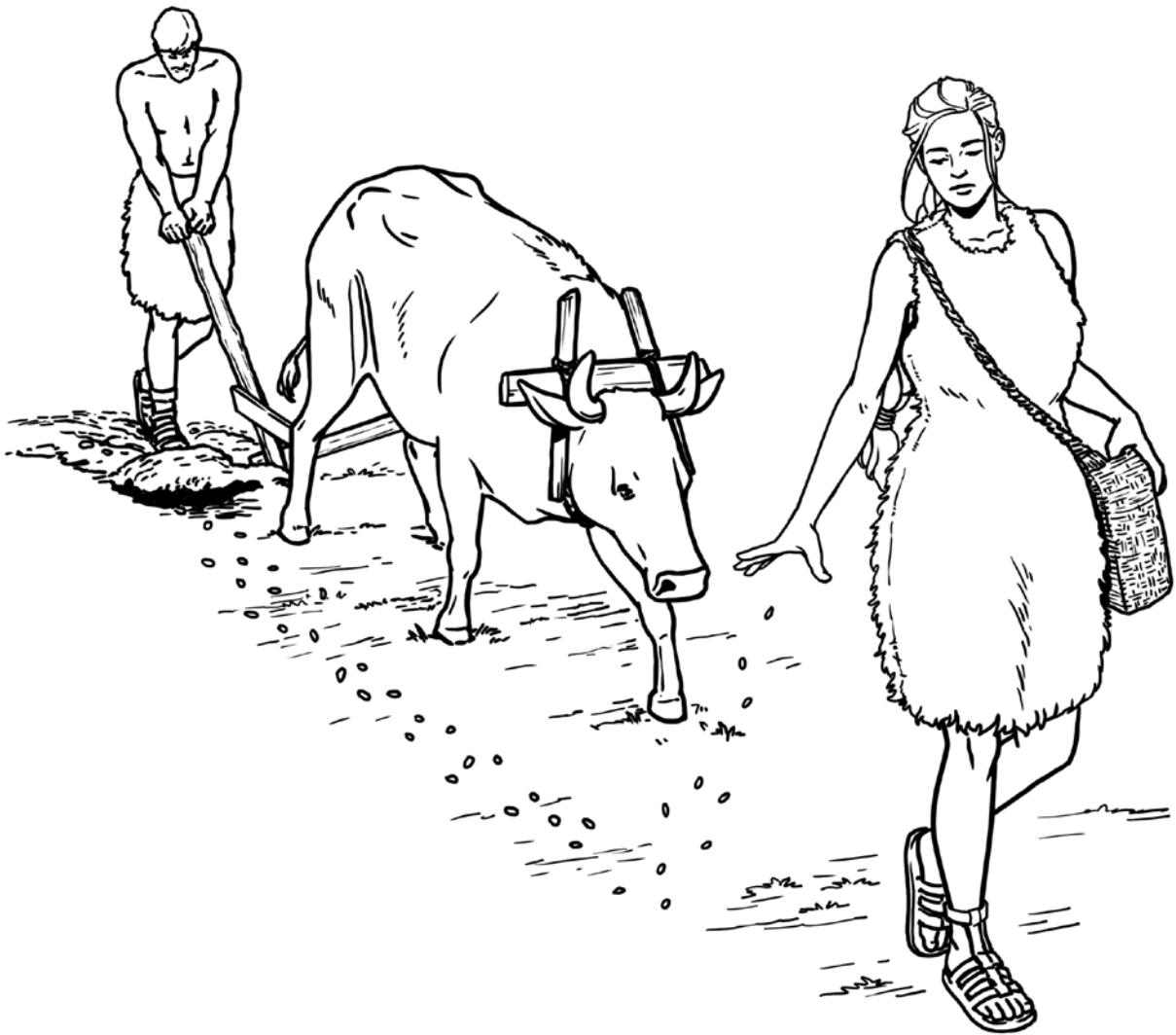


God confronts Adam and Eve after they sinned.
